All meetings of the Fitchburg City council are open to the public. This does not mean that the public participates in all aspects of the meeting. It simply means that the meeting itself, including all discussions and votes, is open for public view.

Executive Session

The only time a Council meeting can be closed to the public is when the Council votes for Executive Session in order to discuss sensitive matters in private, such as pending litigation. Any votes taken however, must be taken in open session.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE PUBLIC TO SPEAK DURING A COUNCIL MEETING:

Public Forum

The Public Forum occurs immediately following the Pledge of Allegiance. The President will ask if anyone in the audience wishes to speak on any matter appearing on the Agenda. If you wish to address the Council, you must stand and be recognized and follow these rules before speaking:

- 1. State your name and city of residence.
- 2. Approach the center table and either stand or sit. This allows you to be seen and heard clearly by everyone in attendance.
- You may speak only on items appearing on the agenda for no more than (2) minutes. Copies of the agenda are available on the center table prior to the meeting.
- Please state the petition, order, ordinance, or resolution number to which you refer.

Public Hearings

Public hearings are held on various issues such as Special Permits and Zoning changes. The same rules apply with the following exceptions:

- 1. You must stand and be recognized either "in favor" or "in opposition" when asked by the Council President.
- 2. You need not refer to the petition number.
- If you have any questions or comments either before or after the meeting,
 - any Councilor would be happy to assist you.

VII. ORDERS – FINANCE

- 196-23. ORDER THAT: the City of Fitchburg hereby approves the expenditure of funds from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs FY24 Greening the Gateway Cities Program Implementation Grant Award in the approximate amount of \$88,650.00 (EIGHTY-EIGHT THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED FIFTY AND 00/100 DOLLARS) for the purpose of said grant, which is to achieve tree planting, promote stewardship and appreciation of Fitchburg's trees for the environmental benefits and energy savings that a healthy tree canopy brings to the residents of the City.
- 197-23. ORDER THAT: the City of Fitchburg hereby approves the expenditure of funds from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs FY24 Greening the Gateway Cities Program Partnership Grant Award in the approximate amount of \$12,944.00 (TWELVE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED FORTY-FOUR AND 00/100 DOLLARS) for the purpose of said grant, which is to assist DCR Urban and Community Forestry as they plant trees in target neighborhoods in Fitchburg to increase tree canopy cover for environmental and energy efficiency benefits.

The words "Game On Way" shall be inserted under the "Name of Street" column;

The words "From the intersection of Industrial Road and Victoria Lane to the entrance of the Game On Facility Entrance" shall be inserted under the "Location" column. (First Reading)

199-23. AN ORDINANCE: Article VII, §169-99 of the Fitchburg City Code, entitled "Specific towing zones designated" as most recently amended, shall be amended as follows:

A new line shall be inserted directly below the line beginning "Richardson Street" and the following words shall be inserted therein:

The words "Roper Road" shall be inserted under the "Name of Street" column;

The words "Both" shall be inserted under the "Side" column;

The words "From Industrial Road to the Westminster Town Line" shall be inserted under the "Location" column.

A new line shall be inserted directly below the line beginning "Scripture Road" and the following words shall be inserted therein: The words "Victoria Lane" shall be inserted under the "Name of Street" column;

The words "Both" shall be inserted under the "Side" column;

The words "Entire Length of Street During Game On Functions" shall be inserted under the "Location" column. (First Reading)

200-23. AN ORDINANCE: Article IV, §169-24 of the Fitchburg City Code entitled "Parking prohibited at all times" as most recently amended, shall be amended as follows: A new line shall be inserted directly below the line beginning "Chapel Street" and the following words shall be inserted therein:

The words "Charles Street" shall be inserted under the "Name of Street" column;

The words "Both" shall be inserted under the "Side" column;

The words "From a point of 50 feet from all four corners of the intersection of Charles and Forest Streets" shall be inserted under the "Location" column. (First Reading)
