Consent Agenda:

A. He would also like for Ms. Alisha Alexander from the County Board of Elections to be placed on the November 15 agenda for a briefing on their needs.

- A. BGE Update Mr. David Wright, External Affairs Manager with BGE briefed Council on BGE's services in the City. They continue working on updating several substations that service the City and worked closely with Tesla on the 2MW Aggregate Net Meter solar farm which produces energy used solely by the City of Bowie.
- B. Eagle X Pro Mr. Kyle Grasser briefed Council on a product they manufacture that improves indoor air quality.
- C. Adoption of Resolution R-67-21 Adopting Housing and Community Development Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) for Fiscal Year 2021 (HUD FY20) Public Hearing held.
